Submissions should be neatly written or typed on an 8½ X 5½ inch format. For artwork, avoid shading, try to use stippling or cross-hatch.

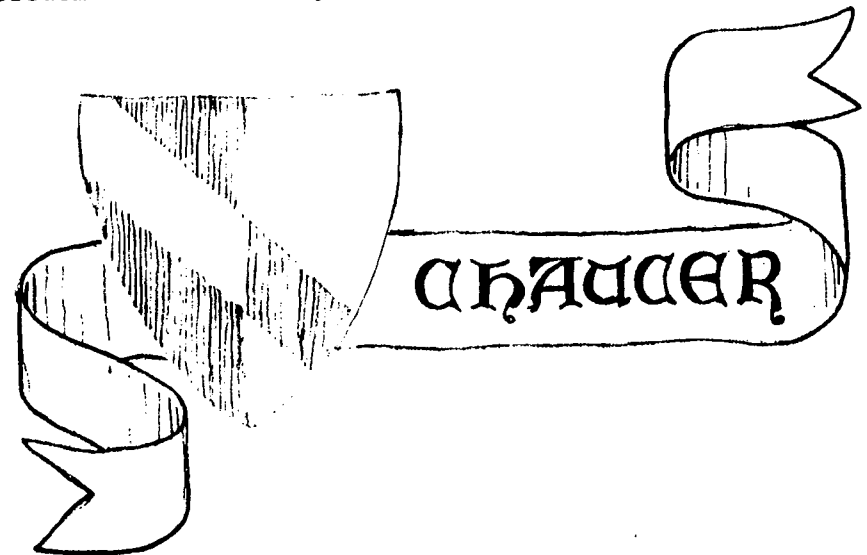
