The Imperfect Unicorn

I will tell you now a story from my home land of Scotland. It is a story so old that its beginnings are lost in time. But I believe it to be true.

You have very likely been told about Unicorns. They are magical beasts of beauty, purity, and perfection. Some say they no longer exist because they would not stop playing to join good St. Noah on his arc, but that is another story.

I believe that Unicorns do exist to this day, but only in a far away magical place. And, of course, they can only be seen by maidens who are truly pure of body, heart, and mind. I was once such a maiden pure, but I believe they do exist because there is a meadow near my girlhood home where once they were said to have played. But that, too, is another story.

What I would tell you today is of a Unicorn who was pure and beautiful, but he was not perfect. When he was born he did seem perfect as all Unicorns are. He was purest white in color with hooves of black and eyes of softest golden brown.

Unicorns, it is said, are not born with horns. Shortly after birth, a few weeks only, a tiny knob appears between the newborn's ears. This knob grows into a horn and by the time the young one no longer needs his mother's milk, the horn is as long as his ears. Thereafter it continues to grow, spiraled but straight, until it reaches its full glory.

The little Unicorn, whereof I speak, was like all other Unicorns at birth. But as his horn began to grow, something never known before was seen. His horn did not grow as it should - spiraled, but straight. It grew crooked. It curled in upon itself. By the time he no longer needed his mother's milk, his horn was only a twisted bit between his ears.

The little Unicorn's mother was agonized with shame for his imperfection, but she loved him with all her mother's heart. She did not know what to do. She feared that the other members of the herd would kill him or drive him into the wilderness before he was old enough to care for himself. She feared that he would be left to the wolves or , worse yet, to men. She was terrified for her young offspring.

The mother talked to the other mares, asking their advice and begging their patience. She sought out the elders of the herd for their counsel. She approached the head stallion and humbly requested his indulgence. The members of the herd were confused and shocked by the situation. There had never been an imperfect Unicorn. They did not know what to do. They knew that the little Unicorn could not stay with the herd, because such a blemish could not be tolerated. Without hid horn a Unicorn is not a Unicorn. This could not be allowed to continue. But Unicorns are, by nature, gentle and loving. They could not kill one of their own or drive him away to perish or (worse yet) be captured. But they could not allow him to stay either.

While the others discussed the problem, the little Unicorn's mother prayed to Blessed Mary to save her son. "Oh, Mother Mary," she said, "you know

hat it is to lose a Son. Please find a way to help me save mine. If he can not remain here with the herd, I only wish that he be allowed to live and have a meaningful life." And so she prayed and Blessed Mary heard her prayer and asked the Father, the Creator of all things, to help. He listened and sent the little Unicorn's mother a message in a dream. In this dream she learnt that her son would live, but that he must leave their home. He must go to the ocean and swim to the far north. When he had swum for a long time he would reach an island. This island would be a safe place and he would lead a long happy life.

At this time the young Unicorn was around a year of age, but had not reached his full size or maturity. But he was purest white, and sleek and strong, and beautiful to see - except his horn. This was still crumpled between his ears and only rose a few inches. The Unicorn's mother told her dream to her son and then to the rest of the herd. They all agreed. And her son, being wise and courageous beyond his age, also agreed.



But more important he saw that the hair of his mane stood up in a crest between his ears and down his neck. His crumpled horn was completely hidden. He never thought about it again. He returned to his new herd and, because of his wisdom and kindness and courage, eventually became the leader. And his blood made his offspring kind and patient and courageous and hard-working.

That is why the ponies of the Shetland Islands are kind and patient and courageous and hard-working. And that is why their manes and tails are of bristly hair and they sometimes have white coats. And once in a very great while, one is born that will have a tiny knob between his ears. When that happens, Blessed Mary smiles.
