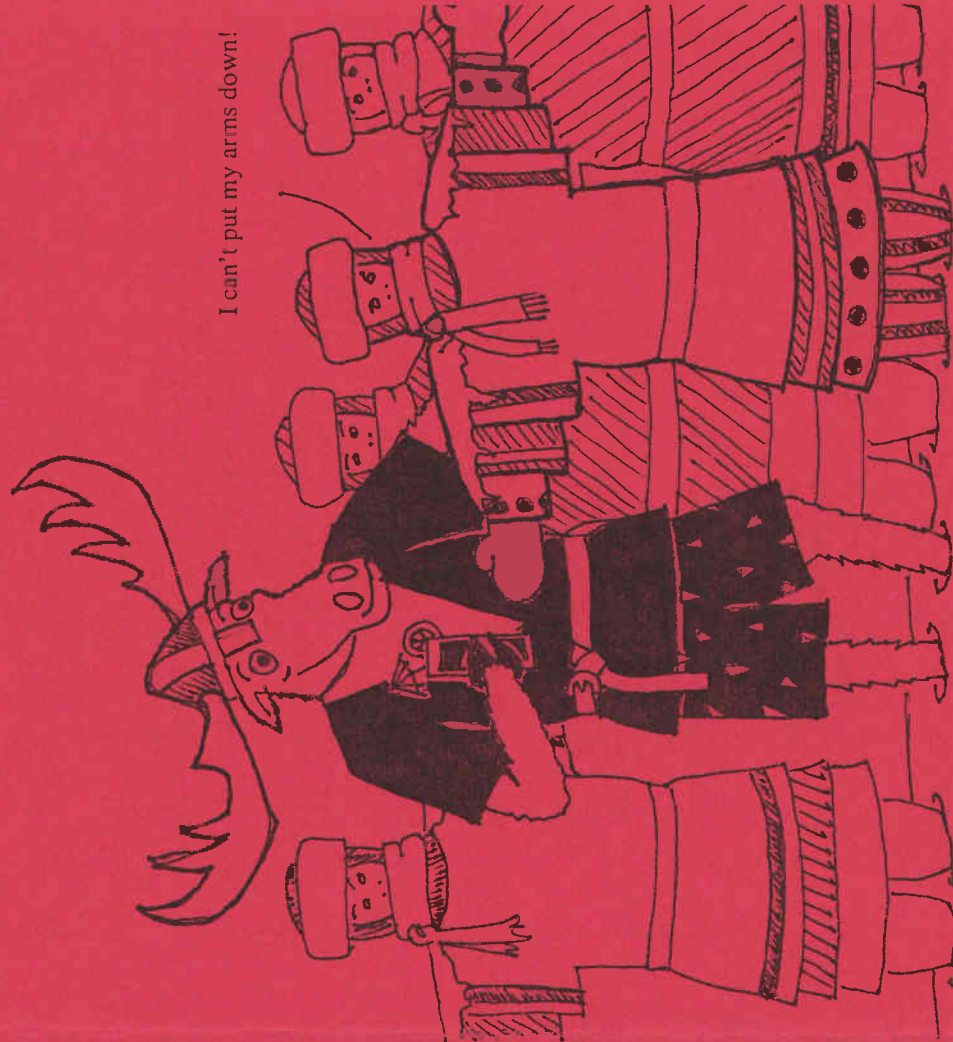

Submissions Policy

All items submitted to the *Moose Call* for publication must be accompanied by a Release for Publication (back inside cover), except submissions by regular (or semi-regular) columnists. Items submitted will remain the property of the submitter and will be returned as appropriate. The *Moose Call* reserves the right to publish submissions as space and time allow.

Submissions that are original works will be credited appropriately. Submissions that are not original works must credit the source in some fashion.

Submissions may be mailed, e-mailed, faxed or given to *Moose Call* staff members. Please see the Officer's Listing for mailing, e-mail addresses and fax numbers. Please use the following guidelines when submitting:

Written: Written submissions are scanned for OCR (Optical Character Recognition). When submitting, please print on plain white paper using 12 point plain font. Drawings and photos are scanned; please make sure they are as clean as possible. Handwritten submissions are accepted and should be as legible as possible.

E-mail: E-mail submissions can either be contained in the body of the e-mail message or sent as a file attachment. If sending as a file attachment, please see disk guidelines below for file formats.

Disk: Disk submissions should be saved as a .txt file (PC) or text file (Mac) on a 3 1/2" disk. If your word processing program offers the option of saving as tagged text, use tagged text instead. Graphic files (drawings and photos) should be saved as grayscale .tif files (PC) or tiff files (Mac).

Photo Policy

All Arm Hold and selected non-local events, pictures may be taken for publication in an upcoming issue of the *Moose Call*. All such photos remain the property of the *Moose Call*.

Per Kingdom Chronicle, we are not required to obtain permission prior to taking your photo; however, if you do not wish to be photographed, please tell the photographer.

Photos submitted for publication in the *Moose Call* must abide by the Submissions Policy and will be credited to the photographer.

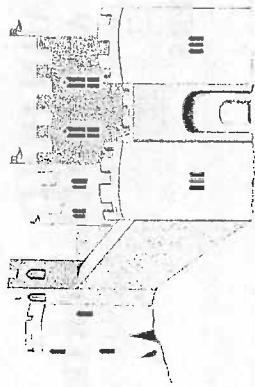

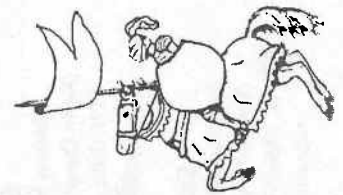
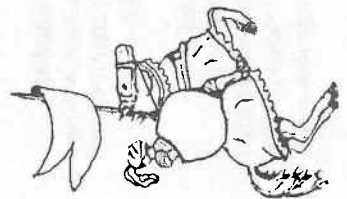
A special thanks to Her Honour Kathlene dubh Fraser and House Von Osten See for autocrattatting a wonderful event! I am especially fond of Mideastern events.

HORSES OF A DIFFERENT COLOR....

On the topic of period breed colors, it has been stated that spotted or pinto horses are found only in modern America. Anyone interested in doing a little research will quickly find that colored horses "are" period and were transplanted in the United States during the Spanish conquest. Below you will find a few period breeds who sport the variations of pinto coloring and spots... horses of a different color.

From the area of Russia:

Altai - an average sized horse with appaloosa coloring.

From the area of Korea:

Cheju - a smaller horse with pinto coloring.

From the area of Brazil:

Pantaneiro - an average sized horse with pinto coloring.

Found in the British Isles:

Shire - a BIG draft horse sometimes found with rare pinto/sabino/splash overo coloring.

Welsh - a small pony to large horse rarely found with pinto coloring. "Pinto coloring" is NOT preferred in either breed listed here and not accepted for registry (but does happen).

Horses with Spanish bloodlines:

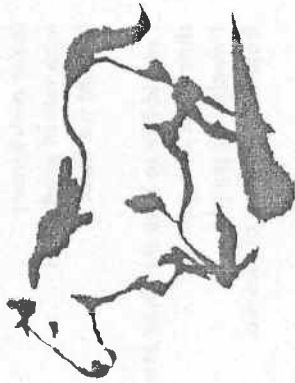
Galiceno - a small horse/large pony with pinto coloring.

Paso Fino - a small to average sized horse with pinto coloring developed in the Central Americas.

Spanish Mustang - average sized with pinto & appaloosa coloring. "Mustang" is a term commonly applied to feral horses found in herds on American federal lands. (It comes from the Spanish term *potro mestizo* which roughly translates as "colt belonging to the grazers".) <http://www.kbrhorse.net/whb/mustang.html>

Knabstruper - a post period name for the Noriker which is an average to large sized horse found in northern Europe with predominately "leopard" spotted appaloosa coloring. <http://www.fortunecity.com/skyscraper/telnet/178/page2.html>

ADVENTURES IN THE MEDIEVAL KITCHEN

March 16th, 2002

The Arn Hold Cooking Guild invites you to come spend a day exploring the real heart of medieval life - the kitchen. This will be a day of hands-on exploration of kitchen life and related domestic skills.

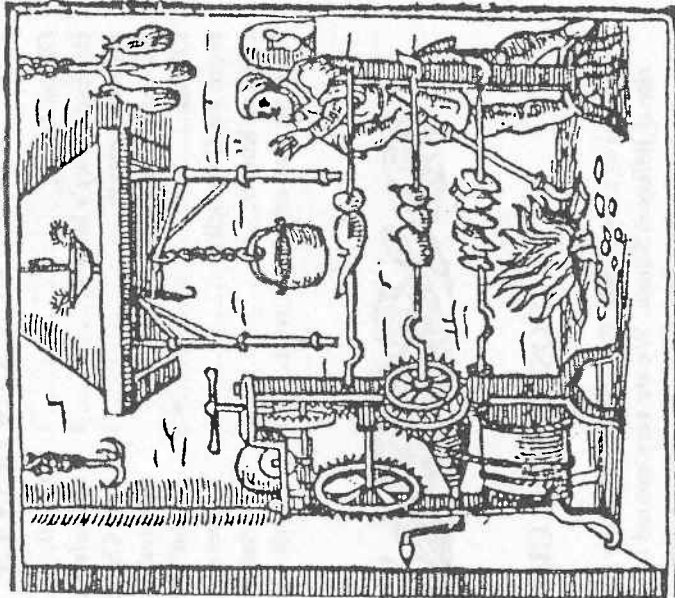
In an attempt to do something a bit different, classes will be organized so that the cooking classes will actually be producing the side dishes for the feast. Learn to make butter and cheese, delicious deserts, and period vegetables. Then enjoy them as they are served in the evening. Non-food classes will include candle dipping, decorating and setting a fabulous table, and planning a feast. In all, more than 10 classes will be offered.

Site opens at 10 AM and closes at 11 PM.

Site: Meridian United Methodist Church Family Life Center, 240 E. Idaho, Meridian, Idaho. Take I-84 west of Boise to the Meridian exit. Head north into Meridian. Turn right at the light on Pine St. The site is on the right, two blocks up.

The site is dry. No pets or smoking allowed.

The feast is being organized by Lady Dawnyel of Arn Hold and will include a variety of meats, vegetables, breads, and a soup. Due to the instructional nature of the feast preparation, there is a limit to 40 people at the feast. For more information regarding the feast or if you have food restrictions, please contact Lady Dawnyel. Off board seating will be plentiful.



There are many other miracles associated with Saint Brigid. She led a holy life, she founded the monastic city of Kildare and wrote many instructions, songs and poems to teach the people about the life of Christ. One of her well known and surviving works is The Heavenly Banquet. Her feast day is celebrated on Feb 1st (14th by the old calendar). On a personal note, my surname, GilleBrighde, translates as servant of Saint Brigid.
