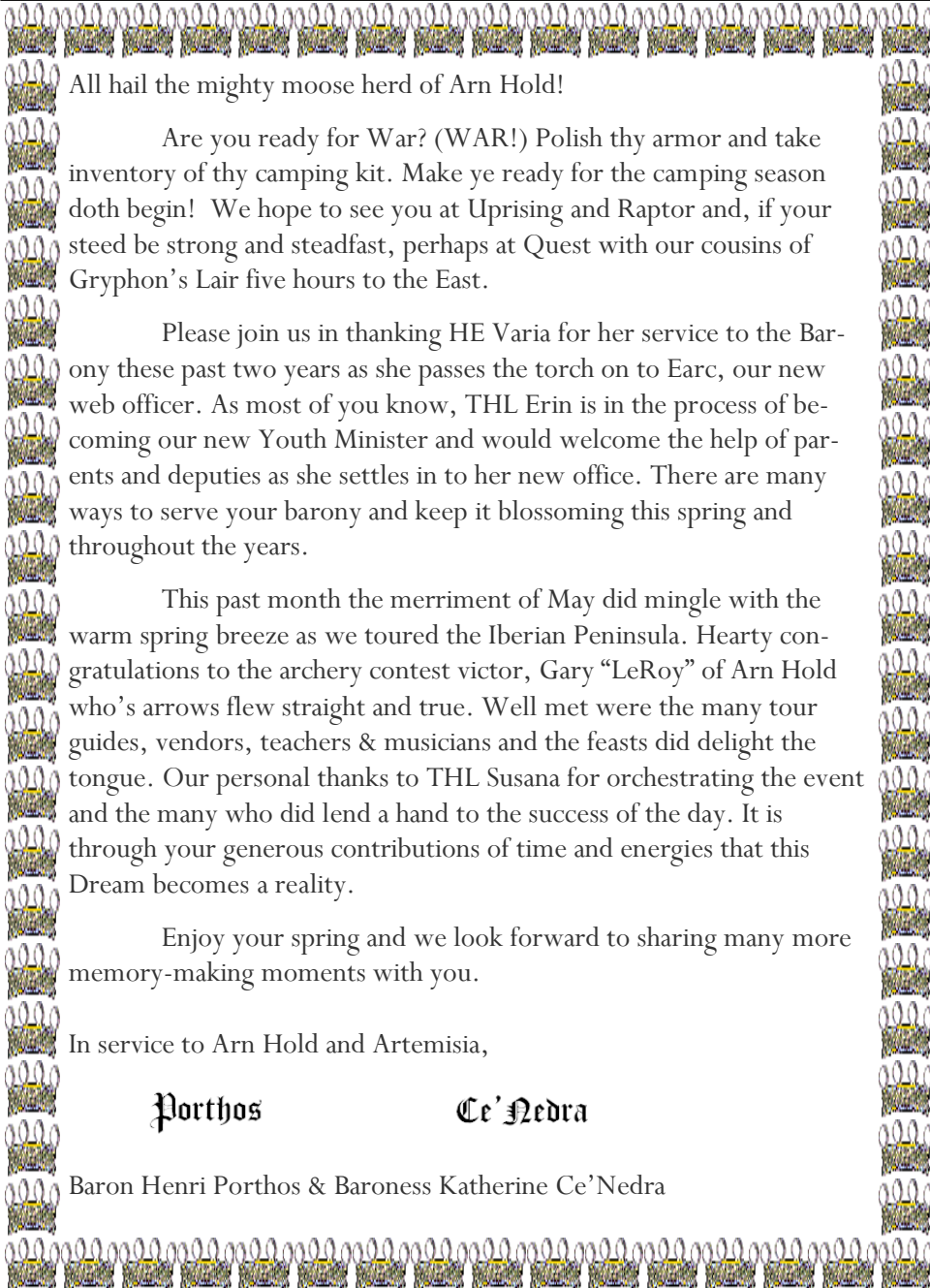

Constable: Quiet month. No one died, no on caught dying. Please check out lost and found.

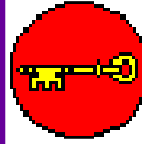

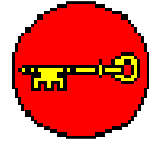
Web Minister: Password has stopped working. Attempting to do updates. Still accepting position applications.

What is a Vigil?

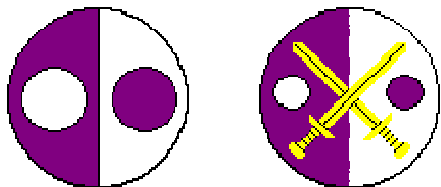
In light of the amount of Peerages in Arn Hold recently (Konrad and Fernando will be Arn Hold's 3rd and 4th Peerages in an 8 month time), there have been several people wondering about this idea of a vigil beforehand. What is it and what goes on?

A vigil in medieval times, as we understand it, was held in a chapel where the Knight-to-be would spend all night praying, contemplating, and fasting. In the morning there would be a bath, and investiture with a white robe. While religion is not part of the SCA, ceremonies such as a vigil are set with the ideal that the candidate for Peerage spend the time contemplating what it means to take on this accolade, and seek counsel from others in this decision.

In truth, the vigil in the SCA has become, in many respects, a chance for family, friends, and acquaintances to spend a little time with the individual to congratulate them and offer them gifts for achieving what is, in a sense, a lifetime achievement award in the given area. In Artemisia, the environment around a vigil has different pieces of tradition, such as a guard for the vigil and the ring of shields or mantles surrounding the vigil; and a gathering of fun, with snacks, music, fire and dancing, &c. There is a vigil book for all to sign and give their words of good tiding. There is also The List. One person is in charge of the 'take a number' aspect of the evening, and they make sure that no one meeting with the individual on vigil takes too long. In Artemisia, it is tradition that everyone is in line, but landed nobility (landed B&B, Crown Prince/Princess, King & Queen) gets bumped to the head of the line since they usually have a full schedule and on a night of multiple vigils, they are expected to make the rounds to all. If there is a member of the Order in line, it is courtesy to let them go before you since they are there potentially for the more serious contemplation and counsel part of the vigil.

What do I do in a vigil? First, I go congratulate them for their recognition of all their work. I offer up some advice in being a new Peer, and ask some specific questions about aspects of being a Peer, both to understand their views, and to get them to contemplate different facets of the Peerage. I try to have some heart-felt token for them to remember my visit by, and I bid them a good day/evening and am on my way.

A vigil is an integral part of the Peerage ceremony, and I hope everyone makes efforts to take the time and give your words to those who will be sitting vigilantly through the night from Arn Hold.
