



## On This Date in History

On November 7, 1492 the Ensisheim meteorite struck a wheat field just outside of the Alsatian town of Ensisheim (then Austrian territory, but now part of France). The meteorite weighed about 280 pounds and left a hole over one meter deep at the impact site. Sightings of the entrance of the meteorite were reported up to 95 miles away from the impact. The meteorite was preserved for King Maximilian and a piece sent to the Vatican for cataloguing. The meteor itself is still visible in the town museum, and the event was recorded in verse by satirist and poet of the time Sebastian Brant and widely distributed by broadsheet.



## Random Carp That I Have Learned

A look at modern practices and their medieval sources by K. Braden von Sobernheim



The Franks were a collection of Germanic tribes that dominated early post-Roman history in Europe. They held Western Europe together until they were divided at the end of the Carolingian empire (mid 9<sup>th</sup> century). As there was no common language of the people between the Gallic, Germanic, or Roman people, they had a *Lingua Franca*, or working language of Medieval Latin.

Amusingly enough, Frank became the term used to describe Europeans in the rest of the non-European Euro-Asian continent. The Mongols called all Europeans ‘Franks’ coming from ‘Frangistan’ and the Ottomans and Persians continued its use. In Southeast Asia, as European merchants and ‘opportunist’ (re: pirates) started appearing in the 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, and later centuries, the local languages started to include *Finnjiyah* or *Faranj* (Arabic), *Faranj* in Thai, or *Ferengi* in Persian, Hindi, and Malay. Thus the pre-disposition of mercantile obsession as well as trade and profit with the word “*Ferengi*” did not start in Star Trek, but along the Far East trade routes. And now you know more random carp.

AVARIS' VEGETABLE SALAT  
\*\*\*\*\*

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup minced onion	garbanzos	beets
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup minced green peppur	kidney beans	turnips
1 cup salat oyly	green beans	chard
1 cup cider venegar	broccoli	green peppurs
3/4 cup sugar or to taste	carrots	mushrooms
1 tsp. salt	pimiento	*cauliflower
$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. peppur	anything else you can think of that's period	

Mix ingredients in left column very well or whirl slightly in blender.  
 Pour over vegetables which should either be raw, or steamed slightly. \*Cauliflower should be marinated separately, or everything tastes like cauliflower.  
 Refrigerate, covered, overnight or until served. Be creative with your Salat!!

## Populace Meeting Notes Oct. 26, 2014

Call to order: 6:10 pm

Chatelaine—loaned out some garb for the Ren Faire and for crown. Mountain Home folks are keeping theirs until 1349 event. Ursula helped with garb at Crown, thank you. September and October demos went well, thank you to those who attended. No upcoming demos to report.

Chronicler—Need a deputy. Please submit articles to the Moose Call and thanks to those who have done so. Remember, anyone can submit. November issue will be out ASAP.

Exchequer—The Barony continues to prosper. Income from rattan and soapstone sales was useful. Had income from Crown Tournament and the Ren Faire. Storage unit has been paid.

Knight Marshal—Only two regular practices took place in October due to local events. Wednesday practices are postponed pending a new space. Please contact Marin if you have a space. All Arn Hold authorized fighters participated in crown. Ren faire turnout was very good, five new people were in armor. Also jousting with Ruger and Nessa and Rapier fighting Sunday. Both were fabulous. One injury. Had some authorizations renewed. Have another six new fighters outside of Ren faire. Usually at least three new fighters each practice, some are even coming back. Would like to do loaner armor silent auction at January event.

Quartermaster—The new trailer worked really well for the Ren Faire. Very nice to have everything in the same place. No major equipment issues at the ren faire. The fence got a lot of notice and looked great. Walls not staked down on baronial tents on Saturday night caused some issues, as there was rough weather. We should get some smaller stakes specifically for that purpose. Before January shelving should be done in the trailer, also padded arm rests for the Baronial thrones.

Rapier—Numbers have been down due to real life issues. Wednesday evening practices have migrated to Killan's garage, looking at historic combat research. Sunday practices might also move to the garage when it gets cold. Would like to purchase a loaner blade for new fighters. The group does have two loaner masks, one women's medium jacket (Ermara has it).

Seneschal—All is well.

Archery—Need a captain.

Pewter Casting—In two weeks there will be a sweat shop for 1349 site tokens (November 11th)

Scribes' Guild—6-8 people attended last meeting, worked on 1349 scrolls and personal projects.

Old Business:

Crown Tournament—194.39 was baronial take-home, 104 people attended, some children. Apologies for children who attended and do not have memberships, no waivers got signed. Please see Kathleen to do so retroactively. Thanks to those who sat at the Reeve's table: Ursula, Ambrose, Aelish, thank you.

Ren Faire—Store was fantastic. Thank you to all who helped. Sold 10 shields, 3 catapults, 8 bags, 5 tabards, lots of pewter, a couple particular requests : adult tabards, shoot a knight booth. Would be nice to have an earlier close time on Sunday. Barony could use a ren faire steward starting in February or so to attend meetings and give feedback. Good contact with people who used to play or who had moved to the kingdom and wanted contact. Thanks to everyone who turned out and were friendly. We give the SCA a good reputation.

Museum Comes to Life will be on for next year, they would like the Barony to attend. We should decide as a group how many demos we would like to commit to in the future.

1349—This will be lots of fun. Please check out the website. Lunch for the event will be chili and baked potato bar. Barony will provide baked potatoes, vegetarian chili. There will be a chili and cornbread cookoff, so bring your best recipe. If you are not bringing chili or cornbread there is a list by alphabet of what potato fixings to bring. # Masked Ball Dances, Set One

Over the next three months, the dance guild mistresses will provide instructions to the dances for the January ball. Here is the first set.

## Caer Galen Musical Chairs

### Mr. Bevridge's Magot

1-8 1s pass right shoulder to opposite sides, honor the 2s, and back to back with the 2s  
9-16 1s turn single, turn RH with the 2s on the sides, then turn LH halfway to get home.  
17-24 1<sup>st</sup> couple cross and cast down around the 2s to end in the center of a line of four facing up WHILE 2s back to back and fall back onto the ends of the line.  
25-32 Lead up a double and back. 1s cross leading up then down around 2s to cast into progressed places.

### Toss the Lady (Offical Bransle)

A line or circle of couples  
The idea is to NOT throw the lady into the ceiling  
Double left, Double right - repeat  
Eight singles left (Repeat Step 2 twice)  
During the 7th step, the lady steps in front of the partner  
During the 8th step, the woman jumps and the man moves her to the left;  
Everyone has a new partner

### Gathering Peascods (Turn Yourself Around)

1<sup>st</sup> Verse:  
8 slip steps to the left  
Turn single  
8 slip steps to the right  
Turn single  
Chorus:  
Men go in, take hands, slip around left and go back out to partner  
Women do the same  
Men double forward and clap (or do Manly arm things), go back  
Women double forward, curtsey and go back  
Men double forward and clap (or do Manly arm things), go back turning single  
Repeat with women going first

2<sup>nd</sup> Verse  
Side right  
turn single  
Side left

turn single

### Chorus

Women go in, take hands, slip around left and go back out to partner  
Men do the same (or do Manly arm things)  
Women double forward and clap, go back  
Men double forward, and clap (or do Manly arm things), and go back  
Women double forward, curtsey, go back turning single  
Repeat from 4.c. with men going first

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Verse

Arm right  
turn single  
Arm left  
turn single

### Chorus

Repeat First Chorus, ending with a reverence to your partner

### Montard Bransle

Lines of 6 dancers  
Dancers follow the leader around the room  
Take 4 left doubles  
Line stops  
1st person turns in place with 4 kicks  
2nd person does likewise (etc.)  
Take 4 left doubles while the 1st dancer weaves through the line (in front of 2nd, behind 3rd, etc. to the end of the line  
Repeat from the beginning with a new Leader

### Strip the Willow

Lines of Four Couples  
1st couple turn or arm right  
1st lady turn or arm left with 2nd man, right with partner, left with third man, right with partner, left with fourth man, right with partner.  
1st man turn left with 4th lady, right with partner, left with 3rd lady, right with partner, left with 2nd lady, right with partner.  
1s turn or arm right at the top.  
1s turn or arm left with 2s, right with each other, left with 3s, right with each other, left with 4s, right with each other, and turn or arm right with each other at the bottom as the new 1s begin.



Items submitted will remain the property of the submitter, and will be returned as appropriate. The *Moose Call* reserves the right to publish submissions as space and time allow, and to edit for grammar and content if necessary. Submissions that are original works will be credited appropriately. Submissions that are not original works must credit the source in some fashion. Submissions may be mailed, emailed, or given to *Moose Call* staff. Please see the Officers Listing for mailing and email addresses. Please use the following guidelines when submitting:

**Written:** Written submissions are transcribed. When submitting, please print on plain white paper using a minimum 12 point plain font. Drawings and hard-copy photos are scanned; please make sure they are as clean and clear as possible. Handwritten submissions are accepted, and should be as legible as possible.

**Email:** Email submissions can either be contained in the body of the email message, or sent as a file attachment. File attachments should be plain text (.txt), rich text (.rtf) or Word document (.doc or .docx) format for text. Graphics and Photos should be saved as JPEG (.jpg or .jpeg) or PNG (.png) as appropriate.

**Photo Policy:** It is the responsibility of the photographer submitting photos for publication to obtain releases from the subjects in the photo. By submitting a photo for publication, the submitter affirms that they have and are giving permission to publish the photo, and that they have obtained all necessary releases from the subject(s).

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
